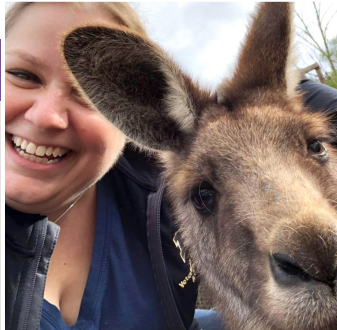

Megan graduated from Brigham Young University in 2000 with a BS in Animal Science with an emphasis in Veterinary Technology. Megan earned her CVT in Oregon and then in 2004 achieved a Veterinary Technician Specialty in Emergency and Critical Care.

Megan is the Small Animal Veterinary Nursing Manager at the Purdue University Veterinary Teaching Hospital where she combines her passions for teaching, hands-on patient care, and team management.

Megan was named the PetPlan Veterinary Technician of the year in 2014, won Best Technician Case Report at both the International Veterinary Emergency and Critical Care Symposium and the North American Veterinary Conference, and was awarded the VMX Technician Speaker of the Year in 2017 and 2018. She has published veterinary technician and nursing articles in the United States, Canada, and the UK.

Megan is the current President of the Academy of Veterinary Emergency and Critical Care Technicians and Nurses (AVECCTN).

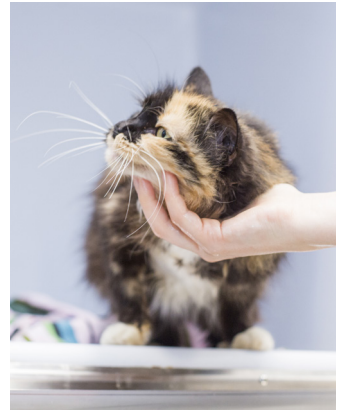
