UQ BrisScience: Adventures in exotic animal medicine

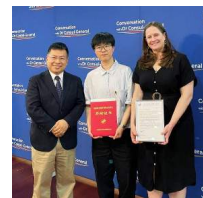

Congratulations Yifei Yang

On 5 September 2024, the Consulate-General of the People's Republic of China in Brisbane held the "Conversation with Dr Consul-General" and the Ceremony of the 2023 Chinese Government Award for Outstanding Self-Financed Students Abroad. Consul-General Dr RUAN Zongze awarded certificates to the winners, presented thank-you letters to the supervisors, and delivered a speech. The event was presided over by Deputy Consul-General Ms LI Suyun.



SVS graduate Yifei Yang, whose thesis was officially conferred by UQ in August 2024, received this globally competitive scholarship. Both Yifei and her principal supervisor, Dr Kris Desovich, were invited to attend the ceremony. Yifei's PhD research focused on fish welfare during live transport, with a particular emphasis on Chinese aquaculture. Yifei's work encompassed animal physiology and behaviour, as well as social science methodologies involving industry stakeholders. Yifei's collaboration with Zhejiang University in China strengthened her academic output, making her one of the standout recipients of this award, as most other awardees were from engineering or other STEM fields.

The event was an opportunity for the general public to go behind the scenes and meet the veterinary staff, conservation specialists and wildlife keepers and find out what it takes to work with wildlife.



SVS Pathology team present at Australia and New Zealand College of Veterinary Scientists (ANZCVS) Science Week 2024

Professor Rachel Allavena, Dr Viviana Gonzalez-Astudillo and Dr Ticiana Brasil Ervedosa were invited to present at the ANZCVS annual meeting, held from July 25-27 on the Gold Coast. Rachel Allavena, who also served as the chapter convener of the Pathobiology chapter, presented an extensive study on pannus in greyhounds in the Ophthalmology section, as well as an epidemiological study on the impact of liver defects on feedlot cattle in the Pathobiology section. Viviana Gonzalez-Astudillo presented her research on the role of koala retrovirus in primary bone tumours in the Zoo and Wildlife section, and Ticiana Brasil Ervedosa showcased a compelling case report on canine mycotic panophthalmitis in the Ophthalmology section. Additional presentations from SVS in the Pathobiology chapter included that of former student Jun Ren Loh who presented an abstract on pyometra in a puppy, and Dr Michelle Story who presented her doctoral work on canine prostate cancer. Their contributions highlighted the innovative research and clinical expertise within SVS.

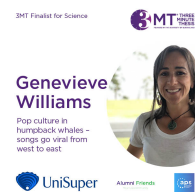
